Official visit of a delegation from the Court of Justice of the European Union to the United Kingdom

As part of the regular contacts which the Court of Justice of the European Union maintains with the highest courts of the Member States, a delegation from the Court of Justice today made an official visit to London, at the invitation of the Judiciary of England & Wales.

The delegation was composed of Mr V. Skouris, President of the Court, Mr K. Lenaerts, Vice-President, Messrs M. Ilešič, L. The delegation held working sessions with members of the highest courts of the United Kingdom, concerning five different subjects: the interpretation and limits of EU law; intellectual property; asylum and citizenship; cases involving issues of national security; and the ECJ's case law on the Charter of Fundamental Rights.

The delegation from the Court was also invited to visit Cambridge Law Faculty yesterday. Another working session was held there with Cambridge academics, in which the main topic addressed was the relation between UK law and EU law.

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
