



Mr Marc van der Woude is elected President of the General Court of the European Union

Following the partial replacement of the Members of the General Court of the European Union,¹ Mr Marc van der Woude, Vice-President of the General Court of the European Union since 20 September 2016, has been elected by his peers to serve as President of the General Court for the period from 27 September 2019 to 31 August 2022. He succeeds Mr Marc Jaeger, President of the General Court from 17 September 2007 to 26 September 2019, who did not stand as a candidate in this election.
